

Module 1: Introduction to Surveying

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Definition


- Art of determining relative positions of points on, above or beneath the earth's surface by means of direct or indirect measurements of distance, direction and elevation
- Application: water supply and irrigation schemes, railroads and transmission lines, mines, bridges and buildings etc



Objective

- To prepare plan or map so that it represent the area on a horizontal plane
- To establish boundary of land
- Site selection for various projects











Classification

- Primarily classified into two-
 - Plane Surveying: type of surveying in which earth's surface is considered plane and spherical shape is neglected
 - Geodetic Surveying: type of surveying in which earths curvature is taken into account









Comparison

Plane Surveying



- Earth surface is considered as a plane surface.
- ☐ The curvature of the earth is ignored.
- The line joining any two stations is considered as a straight line.
- ☐ The triangle formed by any three points is considered as a plane.
- ☐ The angles of the triangle are considered to be plane angles.
- " arried out for a small area < 250km2.

Geodetic Surveying



- Earth surface is considered as a curved surface.
- The curvature of the earth is taken into account.
- The line joining any two stations is considered as a curved line.
- ☐ The triangle formed by any three points is considered as spherical.
- The angles of the triangle are considered to be spherical.
- □ Carried out for a large area >250km2.




Classification (Contd..)

 - Geological











Classification (Contd..)

 - Aerial








Principle of Surveying
